1. Introductions

Subcommittee chair Ken Curtis, called the Colorado River Subcommittee meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

2. CR Updates-Amy Ostdiek, CWCB

- Clarify UCRC motion to study CU credit in Powell or other reservoirs
 - 1. June meeting; August submission
- Update on final Upper Basin plans for new stream gages & eddy covariance towers. There will be a press release on the upper division states submittal and their alternative plans.
- AZ/Tribal settlement with the Navajo, Southern Paiutes & Hopi-Not a lot to report on
- SCPP bill introduced by Colorado Senators Bennett & Hickenlooper
 - 1. System Conservation Pilot Program has pending legislation for reauthorization through 2026
 - 2. Inflation Reduction Act Funding- 3 Buckets-Amy Ostdiek is the contact for Colorado
 - a. Bucket 1: Short term Conservation
 - i. \$450 million in funds will extend to 2031
 - ii. Includes an environmental component
 - iii. Bureau of Reclamation makes decisions
 - iv. Bucket 2W projects needs further clarification. The Bureau of Reclamation will release more

information as it relates to the Upper Division States

- b. Bucket 2: Durable Conservation (B2W)
- c. Bucket 3: Ecosystem Restoration (B2E)
- 3. Roundtable updates & discussion on above topics, Shoshone, last month's presentations from SWCD (Pete) & CRD (DK) and more
 - 2015-2022 used preliminary data. 2005-2015 CWCB preliminary data paired with the Bureau of Reclamation data very well.
 - In June, Reclamation released an updated Consumptive Uses and Losses report, providing data through 2015 that clearly demonstrated the imbalance between the upper and lower basin states water usages.
 - Under the 1922 Compact, the Lower Basin is apportioned 7.5 million acre-feet, plus an additional 1 million acre-feet
 - The draft-infographic showed the Colorado mainstem, tributaries, and transit loss and evaporation used by the Lower Basin well exceeded the apportionment. The Upper Basin used well below the 7.5 million acre-feet.

 - Structural deficit is the difference between supply and demand
 - ICF takes more from Lake Mead; complexity of lower basin accounting
 - EC tower-Kremmling gauges through UCRR and a few others in Colorado
 - UCRC reports what water passes through Lee's Ferry. Upper Basin does not view it as a delivery obligation.
 - Powell & Mead provide a supply driven release over a 10 year average.
 - The infographic will be finalized and released in a couple of weeks.
 - Steve Harris validated the consistency of the usage between the Upper and Lower Basin but noted that information is reported differently.
